

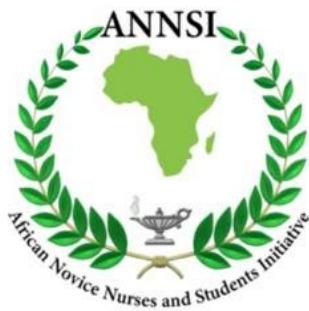

Nurses: Heroes of the Beirut Disaster

The President of the Order of Nurses in Lebanon talks about the tragic explosion, how nurses came out in full force to care for the injured and dying, and the importance of supporting and investing in nurses

Dr Myrna Doumit, President of Order of Nurses in Lebanon, spoke to journalists accredited to the United Nations from around the world at a press conference in Geneva organised by the International Council of Nurses (ICN) on 7 August, just 4 days after a massive explosion in Beirut killed over 150 people and injured thousands.

Before this catastrophe, Lebanese nurses were already facing a difficult situation, Dr Doumit reported. 2020 - the International Year of the Nurse and the Midwife – began with a severe financial crisis in Lebanon which meant many nurses were working without pay; in unsafe working environments; being asked to work for half salaries and taking unpaid vacations. Then came COVID-19, which put nurses under great pressure. In fact, after many discussions and meetings with the government, the nurses of Lebanon, with the support of the physicians and other health professionals, had planned – for the first time in their history – to hold a strike in order to fight for their rights.

International Council of Nurses and SNOMED sign ground-breaking agreement to secure bright future for the International Classification for Nursing Practice

SNOMED International and the International Council of Nurses (ICN) have joined forces in an agreement that will pave the way for the International Classification for Nursing Practice (ICNP®) to be managed, produced, released and distributed by SNOMED International.

This agreement, which is the culmination of years of collaboration between the two organisations, will see ICN retain ownership of ICNP and continue to define its content so that it meets the needs of the global nursing profession.

The agreement aligns with increasing global health digitisation, the widespread use of SNOMED CT-enabled electronic health records (EHR), and the documentation of ICNP-specific content by nurses around the world.

A significant benefit of this agreement removes the need for countries that currently use both ICNP and SNOMED CT to engage in mapping activities between the two systems, which is an effort that was previously required.

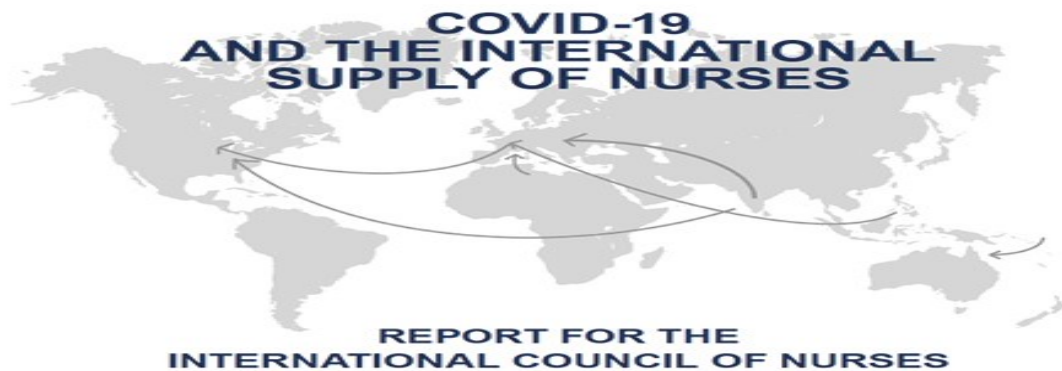

ICN launches new report on COVID-19 pandemic and international supply & mobility of nurses

The International Council of Nurses' (ICN) new report COVID-19 and the International Supply of Nurses reveals the perilous state of the global supply of nurses and how it has left so many poorer states with fewer nurses than they need. It also calls for the implications of the COVID-19 pandemic on nurse mobility to be taken into full consideration.

The report, written by Professor James Buchan, Adjunct Professor, University of Technology, Sydney and ICN Chief Executive Officer Howard Catton, released today, underlines that if high-income countries continue to recruit large numbers of overseas nurses, they will undermine the ability of low and middle-income countries to cope with the virus and dangerously weaken their health systems.

The report argues that high-income countries must train enough nurses to meet their own needs if low-income countries are to have a chance of coping with the pandemic. The world is facing a global shortage of nearly six million nurses, the vast majority of which – 89% - are in low and middle-income countries. The report highlights wide variations between countries in the number of nurses trained every year, which has led to one in eight nurses, approximately 3.5 million, working in a country that is different from the one they were born or trained in.

The ICN report says that unless there is a step change in the number of nurses trained in high income countries so that they finally make progress to become self-sufficient, poorer countries will continue to suffer, lose nurses to overseas jobs, and struggle to meet their own healthcare system's needs.

Global virtual gathering of nurses and midwives outlines actions to be taken to protect individual nurses and midwives and strengthen the professions in the post-COVID-19 era

More than 600 of the world's leading nurses and midwives discuss plans to strengthen the professions' leadership and education, put them at the centre of policy and planning decision-making, and ensure there are sufficient numbers available to cope with increasing future health demands.

Leaders of the world's nursing and midwifery professions have issued a joint statement following the recent ICN, International Council of Midwives and World Health Organization (WHO) TRIAD meeting, which was hosted virtually in Geneva.

More than 600 nurses and midwives, including government level Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officers and representatives from ICN's 130-plus National Nursing Associations, discussed the future of the professions.

The statement highlights key issues for the professions at this unique moment in time, including the need to implement the recommendations of the first WHO State of the World's Nursing report, support leadership, education and training in both professions, and implement human resource management in the context of COVID-19, which includes keeping healthcare workers safe.

ICN President Annette Kennedy said:

"The pandemic has shown the world that nurses' knowledge is essential to health care because of their unique relationship with patients, their families and communities. Nurses have earned their place at the table whenever healthcare policy and planning decisions are being made.

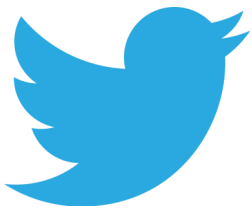
